WhoDID Design

WhoDID facilitates in-person interactions by helping friends of the system identify the fronting alter.



Recently, we have started the development and testing of a high-fidelity prototype.



Lessons Learned

Wait for Consensus - Plan for extra time to allow the system to come to an agreement, don't expect fast decisions.

Consider Diversity - Each alter is a user with their own preferences, wants and needs, allow for customization.

Ponder Ethics - Avoid triggering alter switches as these are painful, stay away from intense discussions.
